If you haven't already, I encourage you to read the story of Gideon in Judges 6-8.

Have you ever faced something in life that felt near impossible, or maybe you are facing that time right now, but my guess is, you have been faced with an impossible situation? But what about an impossible situation but in the end, it was only God that got you through. He received all the glory, because the only explanation was God?! One of my favorite stories in the Bible, that leaves me in total awe of Him, is the story of Gideon and his battle with the Midianites. Gideon was faced with a completely impossible situation. Logically all odds were against him. And what we know of Gideon is that he came from a very weak tribe, and was the weakest of his family. Let's just say Gideon would not have been picked first to lead an army. But what Gideon did have was an army of 32,000 men. But God says-I'm going to hand Midian over to you, but you must first narrow your army down to about 300 men. From 32,000 to 300. Gideon and his army of 300 men were going to war with one of the toughest, meanest and strongest armies of his time, with only 300 men. But the story doesn't stop there, God says, put away your swords and your armor, I want you to go to war with instruments and pottery-trumpets and jars! If

Gideon were to give me orders to put my weapons down and grab a jar and trumpet, after he made our army so small, I can tell you I would have for sure thought "yeah we're going to die, no way we come out of

this alive". But I want to talk about what Gideon did. Gideon was fearful, this didn't make sense, he probably looked extremely silly to his army of men to give them those crazy orders. But what did Gideon do when He was fearful and when nothing made logical sense? He let his obedience to God surpass his own conclusions. And in verse 15 of chapter 7 we see that after God gives Gideon confirmation of His plan,

he worships God! His worship becomes his greatest weapon. So my encouragement is to trust God and let your obedience surpass your own conclusions. And to also let your worship be your greatest weapon and watch how God can work through the impossible and He will receive all the glory!




We are always so thankful for all our partners across the country. And what a privilege to be able to speak to three different congregations this last month.
