Teams have traveled to the heart of Appalachia from Texas, Ohio, Michigan, Tennessee, Massachusetts, Virginia and Wisconsin. It has been through the willingness of these teams to come and partner with us, many stories of Christ's compassion, love, and hope has been shown in very real and tangible ways. What a blessing to serve beside each person, church, and family this past summer! You are a major reason ARO continues to be vibrant and lasting ministry for Christ in the Appalachian Mountains!

A Note from ARO Executive Director, Dwayne Mills

The '19 summer at ARO has been extremely busy. ARO hit the ground running the first week of June and saw our final team for our summer schedule, depart last Thursday morning, August 22. Even though there are a few more Work & Witness teams scheduled for September and October, our busy time of partnering with these teams have slowed down. To date we have seen 17 W & W teams in 2019. These teams include a total of over 220 participants from 10 states, 6,776 work hours have been logged, over \$120,000 dollars invested through project dollars, work hours, buying food & materials locally for teams, and other avenues to help the local economy where these dollars have been spent. Our partnerships with these teams have seen us work in schools, home projects, county-wide trash pick-ups, partnership with Addiction Recovery Care, Celebrate Recovery, work to maintain and beautify the campus of ARO, and many more areas of ministry in Martin County and beyond.
