Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths. Proverbs 3:5-6

Proverbs 3:5-6 is a passage I share a lot as I travel and speak on behalf of Appalachia Reach Out. Even though this is a passage of scripture most followers of Jesus can quote, it can be a challenge to live out.

Verse 5 is more well-known than verse 6. The end of this passage has been challenging me in my personal life in recent days. As a follower of Jesus I realize trust is foundational to my faith. I have to ask myself the question; do I live a true and devoted life of trust in Jesus each day (In all things and in every way)?

As I read through the passage it ends with the words "...He will make straight your paths". Sometimes I find myself making the mistake of translating this to mean, easy, but this so far from the truth. There are times in our faith journey that "easy" would be the farthest thing from describing our journey. In looking at the text again it says, "straight". It reminds me of another passage of scripture found in Isaiah 40:4 which says, "Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain".

In light of eternity, today, Jesus is making straight paths for me as I keep my eyes on Him and trust Him with ALL. My faith and trust in Him allows me to see the bigger picture when I'm walking through difficult times. The challenges I face in this life is only for a short time in light of eternity. I must have faith He makes "straight" all things as I trust Him, lean on Him, and acknowledge Him. What do you choose today? Are you walking straight paths of faith? It's our choice?

Appalachia Reach Out is excited to welcome our first team for 2024! Starting in March, Dordt University will kick off the new year followed by Olivet Nazarene University the next week. Both will be bringing students to the Martin County site. These teams will be volunteering in the local schools, at Celebrate Recovery and other area non-profits, and at work site projects all while being immersed in the Appalachia culture. ARO continues to have an eternal impact on the communities we serve and on those who graciously give of their time and resources. Below are a few statistics of the work our teams from all over the country have participated in and given to ARO since January 2021 (this is NOT an exhaustive list).

- Volunteer Work Hours 57,995
- Local Economic Impact \$2,339,779.50
 - Martin County, KY \$1,444,478
 - Nicholas County, WV \$381,419.40
 - Perry County, KY \$513,882.10

These numbers do not include other initiatives ARO has been part of, such as, the ice storms and flooding in 2021 in eastern Kentucky and the tornado relief in western Kentucky in 2021–2022. In addition, there have been millions of dollars of resources and gift cards donated. To God be the glory!
